



PAUL CRAIG is currently a Professor of English Law at the University of Oxford and a Fellow of St John's College. His fields of specialization and research interests include Administrative Law, Constitutional Law, European Community Law, and Human Rights Law. He has published widely in the aforementioned fields, and has been granted several prizes for his work, such as the Gibbs Prize in 1972, thae Henriques Prize in 1973, and the Vinerian Scholar in 1974.
